

Photographers exhibition sure to Capture your attention

As soon as she had compiled her list of photographers, Alison Bernard knew she had the makings of a superb exhibition.

Bernard, director of **The Village Gallery** in Port Credit, told *The News* she always wanted to host a photography show, but things never quite fell into line. Until, that is, she arranged for photographers Paul Teolis, Simeon Posen, Russell Brohier and Loys de Fleuriot to exhibit their works at the gallery as part

of the *Capture* exhibition.

"It was something I always wanted to do; it had been in the back of my mind for quite a while, but I was waiting for the right mix of photographers," Bernard said.

The exhibition opens with a reception today from 1-5 p.m. All four photographers will be in attendance. The show runs until March 15.

Teolis, winner of the Best Photograph award at the 2006 Contact Photography Festival, has worked in animation for organizations such as Disney, The National Film Board of Canada and DreamWorks SKG. He has travelled to 30 countries on five continents, snapping shots along the way.

Posen, born and raised in Toronto, is a landscape and architectural photographer with more

Brohier was trained in traditional photographic and dark room techniques while studying architecture at the University of Toronto in the early 1980s.
